

RULES, REGULATIONS AND GENERAL INFORMATION

ALL MEMBERS AND EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING THE RULES GOVERNING OUR HORSE SHOWS.

A Rule Book is Available in the Show Office

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. The Horse Show Management shall decide all questions not covered in this premium; its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of the entries and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages, to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors to change rings or rotate judges, to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants.

Exhibitors are responsible for knowledge of the rules governing the horse show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of violation of the cross entry restriction, the entry will forfeit its entry fee, class placing, and prize money.

For every horse entered herein for competition, the horse will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the show management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the show is held blameless for any loss or accident to himself, his horses, employees or equipments which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

ENTRY PROCESS: Complete your entry online at [www. Horseshowtime.com](http://www.Horseshowtime.com) or fill out the printable entry form located and fax to 702-583-7352. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED BY SATURDAY 5 P.M. PRIOR TO THE SHOW DATE. After this date, the \$15.00 Post Entry Fee will be added. NO PHONE ENTRIES. In case of a minor, the parent or guardian must sign entry form and provide an emergency phone number. Payment does not need to be made with pre-entries. Full payment in the form of cash or blank check MUST be left with the show office in order to receive numbers.

Trainers must leave a trainer's check before any numbers will be released to clients by the office. Trainers' checks will be available for return after the last client has checked out with the office.

ATTENTION ADDITIONAL RIDERS OF SHARED HORSE: All riders must check in and leave a check in the office even if the horse's

number has been released to another rider.

Exhibitors that compete without being entered and those who enter at the gate will be charged double. Incomplete entry forms, such as those that have no classes listed, are subject to post entry fee. IF PAYING IN CASH, NO ENTRY CHANGES WILL BE ALLOWED. A \$40 fee will be imposed on any returned check. Returned checks will not be processed a second time and payment must be received in the form of money order, cashier's check, or cash within 10 days of notice for original amount plus the penalty. Tack stall splits shall be submitted by trainers during the show, not later than Friday afternoon. Show office hours: Thursday, 9a-5p, Friday, 8a-5p, Saturday/Sunday, 7a-30 minutes after show ends. Horses on show grounds for schooling only must have an entry form submitted and pay grounds or stall fees.

BRAIDING OPTIONAL

FEES:

Regular Class - \$17, Stakes Class - \$20, Leadline Class - \$10 (flat fee), Medal Class - \$20, CPHA Medal Class - \$25, SNHJA Non-Member Fee - \$30, Grounds Fee - \$55 (no stall required), Post Entry Fee - \$15 (per show), Vendor Fee - \$40, Stall Fee - \$55 (bedding not included), Jump Set-Up Fee - \$5 (per horse/rider combination), RV Hook-Ups - \$15 per night, SNHJA Show Fee (Mandatory) - \$15 per horse/rider combination

MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors (juniors) shall hold the SNHJA, Clark County (Horseman's Park) and Show Management harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted without the signature of parent or guardian on the entry form. The signatures of instructors, agents, or other unrelated persons will not be accepted.

JUDGES: It is the purpose of the Management to run the horse show at the highest possible level of sportsmanship. The judges' decisions in the show ring are their own responsibility and management accepts no responsibility for those decisions. No one shall approach a judge without first obtaining an appointment.

AGE DIVISIONS: The age of an individual on December 1, 2009 (in accordance with USEF rules) will be maintained throughout the entire competitive year (on November 30, 2010, whichever is sooner).

ATTIRE: Proper hunt attire. Jackets required unless announced otherwise at the judge's discretion. Properly fitting protective headgear must be worn when riding anywhere on the show grounds. As required by the USEF, all riders must wear an approved, harnessed safety helmet that meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag.

PARKING: All vehicles and trailers must be parked at least 30 feet from

the barns per fire marshal regulations.

SCHOOLING: An adult must supervise junior riders jumping in the warm-up arena and during schooling rounds. Schooling fences must be jumped in the proper direction. Schooling rounds in the show arena are available. **Wednesday afternoon after jump setup, Thursday before noon & evening, Friday before 9am & evening, Saturday before 7:30am & evening, and Sunday before 7:30am. There is a limit of 10 riders in the arena at any time. Courtesy is the rule in warm-up arenas. People on foot or lunging in the warm-up arena, please give way to riders schooling over fences.**

DOGS AND OTHER PETS: Dogs or other pets in stable area or anywhere on the grounds must be on a **lease and supervised**. People with pets exhibiting **aggressive behavior** may be asked to immediately remove the pet from the show grounds.

CLEAN UP – Horseman's Park assess SNHJA a fee based on the extent of clean up that is required by their crews. To lower this cost, please clean up after yourself and your horse. Do not leave bulk shavings on the ground. Shavings only, no straw allowed. For horses tied to trailers, please put your manure at the end of the barns. **NO MANURE IN THE TRASH CANS**. If you place manure in trashcans, you will be charged a fee.

HC – A rider who wishes to warm-up or ride in a class with cross-entry restrictions without losing SNHJA year-end points in their division may enter any such class as "HC" which means they will not be judged and will not receive a ribbon or points. "HC" riders must adhere to the course as posted and should ride first in the order of go. There will be no "HC" riders allowed in any flat class. Also, riders may not ride "HC" in an "A" division when showing in the "B" division of the **SAME** class.

CLASSES: Each class must have at least two riders entered for the class to be held. If there are less the three riders, half points will be awarded and there will be no champion or reserve champion during the show.

Show Secretary has sole authority to make division assignments. See postings outside office the night before competition to confirm "A/B" assignments. "A" and "B" divisions in large classes will be combined the night before competition if there are no horse conflicts for less than 10 entries for Crossrails and Walk/Trot; for less than 16 entries for all other classes divided into divisions. In the "A" and "B" divisions, "A" riders cannot ride in "B" division and "B" riders cannot ride in "A" division.

ABUSE: Competitors who abuse horses will be eliminated by the judge and/or the SNHJA board and may be subject to fines or additional penalties.
