The schedule for each show will vary to accommodate the number of entries and to include special classes. Registration for classes ("entries") must be submitted online at **www.horseshowtime.com**. Membership form, Release of Liability form, Stall Request Form, show schedule, and other information are available at <u>www.snhja.com</u>.

HORSE SHOW REMINDERS



When you are removing horses from Horseman's Park, please lock the stall doors.

Dogs or other pets on show grounds must be on a leash and supervised at all times. There will be a \$25 fine for each instance of a dog off a leash and a call to Animal Control for non-compliance





Only blue or green painters tape will be allowed for labeling stalls or posting anything in the barn area.



Parking and RV Use:

1. No parking is allowed within 30 feet of Horseman's Park barns. Besides this being a violation of fire code, it prevents park staff from picking up manure. Park police can give a ticket to violators.

2. Do not park in front of RV stations if you are not using them.

3. IMMEDIATELY AFTER HOOKING UP YOUR RV TO AN RV STATION, notify the Show Office.

4. Fee applies. See fee schedule on subsequent page.

5. Violators will receive a written warning posted on their RV if they have not registered their RV at the Show Office. If you ignore the warning, your RV could be subject to TOWING.

6. Barbeques with flames or any kind of cooking with flames are not permitted on the grass area outside the show office or in the barn area. A designated pit is available behind the bleachers.

SNHJA CODE OF CONDUCT

This Code of Conduct establishes a standard of behavior for riders and trainers of SNHJA. It aims to ensure a respectful, safe, and positive environment for all participants, fostering the growth and enjoyment of the sport.

By participating in SNHJA activities, riders and trainers agree to adhere to this Code of Conduct.

1. Respect and Fair Play

- 1. Treat all individuals with dignity and respect, including competitors, officials, volunteers, and spectators.
- 2. Show respect to horses, understanding their needs and welfare come first.
- 3. Accept decisions and results gracefully, demonstrating good sportsmanship at all times.
- 4. Recognize that results and decisions by the judge, board or show management are final.

2. Safety and Welfare

- 1. Prioritize the physical and mental well-being of horses at all times.
- 2. Ensure horses are properly cared for, including appropriate feeding, grooming, exercise, workloads and medical attention.
- 3. Use appropriate and well-maintained equipment, including helmets and protective gear.
- 4. Employ training methods that are focused on the well-being of both horse and rider.

4. Responsibilities of Riders

- 1. Come to events and training sessions prepared, both physically and mentally.
- 2. Maintain a high standard of personal grooming and horse care.
- 3. Cooperate with officials and adhere to their instructions.
- 4. Take responsibility for your actions and those of your horse.
- 5. Know and abide by the rules published in the SNHJA Premium, including deadlines and cross-entry restrictions.
- 6. Address any issues or concerns with your trainer or relevant officials promptly.

5. Responsibilities of Trainers

- 1. Provide clear, constructive guidance and support to riders.
- 2. Promote a positive training environment that fosters growth and development.
- 3. Ensure all training practices adhere to the highest standards of safety and ethics.
- 4. Maintain open, honest communication with riders, parents, and officials.
- 5. Know and abide by the rules published in the SNHJA Premium, including deadlines and cross-entry restrictions.
- 6. Address any issues or conflicts in a professional and timely manner.

AWARDS INFORMATION

Ribbons will be awarded through 6th place for those divisions with jumps greater than 2'0" and through 8th place for divisions 2'0" and less. Entries must show in two classes per division to qualify for the show championships. Points are awarded as follows: 1st place-6 points, 2nd place-4 points, 3rd place-3 points, 4th place-2 points, 5th place-1 point. If there are 11 or more entries add 2 points per place. With 2 in a class half points are awarded. 1 in a class gets 1 point. If there are 20 or more in a class, the class will be split. The winner of a tie is the one who won the last class of the division. Champion and Reserve Champion are awarded in the following divisions:

YEAR END AWARDS

Eligibility: Each rider must be a member of SNHJA as of show date (no retroactive points if you join after showing). **To be eligible for** *a year-end award, rider must compete in at <u>least three shows</u> and three times in a division during the year.* Annual champion and reserve champion awards are *normally* presented at the Season-End banquet in the following divisions.

Specific horse/rider combinations that have won Champion or Reserve Champion two times in the Walk/Trot, Walk/Trot Barely Canter, Beginning Canter, Beginning Eq & Hunter and Mini Eq & Hunter divisions will no longer be eligible for season-end awards. The horse/rider combination may continue to show in the division in subsequent seasons but will not earn points or win season-end prizes after winning Champion or Reserve Champion a total of two times.

Points: The rider accumulates points in equitation classes. The horse accumulates points in hunter classes and jumper classes. Riders may show on different horses throughout the year. The rider accumulates points in Walk/Trot, W/T Barely Canter, Beginning Canter and Beginning Rider divisions.

Final Decisions: The SNHJA Board makes final decisions regarding all awards and eligibility in accordance with USHJA requirements. SNHJA decisions are final and nonnegotiable.

SOUTHPOINT USHJA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFICATION

SNHJA nominates riders for the USHJA National Championship at South Point in accordance with USHJA requirements.

Per USHJA, each affiliate club may develop their own rules for nominating riders. USHJA has the final decision on who is accepted.

All divisions over 2ft are eligible. To qualify, the horse/rider combination must have competed in three shows within the eligible division during that show year.

SNHJA nominates the 1st, 2nd, and, if permitted, 3rd place riders from the qualifying divisions based on year-end points.

Riders do not need to express interest in a nomination.

Nominations may be declined but are not transferable or negotiable. If a rider declines a nomination, the nomination moves down the list to the next-highest point holder within that division.

RULES REGULATIONS AND GENERAL INFORMATION

The Premium rule book will be available in the show office. Show office hours are approximately **Saturday/Sunday 7am-5:30 pm** or until show ends. Show office hours may vary depending on show schedule and staff availability.

CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION: The Horse Show Management reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of, or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. The Horse Show Management shall decide all questions not covered in this premium: its decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves to itself the right to disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of the entries and cancel award prizes, without any claim for damages, to change any course, to cancel or combine any unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors to change rings or rotate judges, to change specifications in jumper classes as competition warrants. Exhibitors are responsible for knowledge of the rules governing the horse show and for their own errors and omissions. In the case of violation of the cross-entry restriction, the entry will forfeit its entry fee, class placing and prize money.

For every horse entered herein for competition, the horse will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the show management will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, and the officials, employees, directors, officers, sponsoring entities of the horse show and the facilities at which the show is held blameless for any loss or accident to himself, his horses, employees or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or other cause.

2. ENTRY PROCESS:

- a) Submit all entries online at <u>www.horseshowing.com</u>.
- b) Exhibitors may not compete without being entered.
- c) Payment does not need to be made with online entries. Full payment in the form of cash, credit card or blank check must be left with the show office in order to receive rider numbers.
- d) Trainers must leave a trainer's check at the office before any numbers will be released to clients. Trainers' checks will be available for return after the last client has checked out with the office.
- e) All riders must check in and leave a check in the office even if the horse's number has been released to another rider.
- f) Release of Liability forms must be signed before any Exhibitor rides a horse on the show grounds.
- g) Entries must be received before the due date announced for each show. After the due date, the \$25.00 Post Entry Fee will be added.
- h) Horses on show grounds for schooling must have an entry form submitted and pay non-showing horse fees as well as grounds or stall fees.
- i) In case of a minor, the parent or guardian must sign entry form and provide an emergency phone number.
- j) A \$40 fee will be imposed on any returned check. Returned checks will not be processed a second time and payment must be received in the form of money order, cashier's check, credit card, or cash within 10 days of notice for original amount plus the penalty.

3. STALL/SHAVINGS REQUEST:

- a) Trainers (or riders not working with a trainer) must submit a stall and shavings request through horseshowing.com by the required due date for each show.
- b) A minimum of two bags must be purchased for each horse stall, per Park rules.
- c) Trainers may inform the show office how to distribute the bulk shavings charges across riders if desired.
- d) Riders or Trainers may BRING their own shavings to Horseman's Park but may not DELIVER their own shavings to Horseman's Park.

- 5. **MINOR EXHIBITORS**: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors (juniors) shall hold the SNHJA, Clark County (Horseman's Park) and Show Management harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry will be accepted without the signature of parent or guardian on the entry form. The signatures of instructors, agents or other unrelated persons will not be accepted.
- 6. **JUDGES**: It is the purpose of the Management to run the horse show at the highest possible level of sportsmanship. The judges' decisions in the show ring are their own responsibility and management accepts no responsibility for those decisions. No one shall approach a judge without first obtaining an appointment.
- 7. **AGE DIVISIONS**: In accordance with USEF rules, the age of an individual as of December 1 of the PRIOR YEAR will be maintained throughout the entire competitive season. For the 2024-2025 show season, the age as of 12/01/2023 will be used.
- 8. **PARKING**: All vehicles and trailers must be parked at least 30 feet from the barns per fire marshal regulations.
- 9. SCHOOLING: An adult must supervise junior riders jumping in the warm-up arena and during schooling rounds. Schooling fences must be jumped in the proper direction. The show arena will be available Friday after 2PM and until 7:00AM on Saturday and Sunday. Friday and Saturday schooling is permitted after the conclusion of show classes. There is a limit of 10 riders in the arena at any time. Courtesy is the rule in warm-up arena. People on foot or lunging in the warm-up arena, please give way to riders schooling over fences.
- DOGS AND OTHER PETS: Dogs or other pets in stable area or anywhere on the grounds must be on a leash and supervised. A
 \$25 fine will be charged for loose dogs and Animal Control will be contacted if the dog is not claimed and the fine paid. People with pets exhibiting aggressive behavior may be asked to immediately remove the pet from the show grounds.
- 11. **CLEANUP**: Horseman's Park assesses SNHJA a fee based on the extent of cleanup that is required by their crews. To lower this cost, please clean up after yourself and your horse. Shavings only, no straw allowed. For horses tied to trailers please put your manure at the end of the barns. <u>NO MANURE IN THE TRASH CANS</u>. If you place manure in a trash can you will be charged a fee.
- 12. **CLASSES:** Each class must have at least **one** rider entered for the class to be held. If there are fewer than three riders, half points will be awarded, one point for one rider, and there will be no champion or reserve champion during the show. Show Secretary has sole authority to make division assignments. A tentative division of A/B assignments will be posted ahead of time the night before, subject to change if there are additions or scratches in the division. The assignments will be sent to trainers and posted on Facebook, but riders need to be ready for any changes. In "A" and "B" divisions, "A" riders cannot ride in "B" division.

- 13. **ABUSE**: Competitors who abuse horses may be eliminated by the judge and/or the SNHJA board and may be subject to fines and/or additional penalties.
- 14. **RIDER FALLS:** In the event of a rider fall and evaluation by on-site medical stand-by services, if medical service personnel recommends the rider be further evaluated off-site at doctor's office or hospital, SNHJA requires that the rider suspend further riding or competing until a medical release from an offsite provider is presented in the show office.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

Warm up Classes

WARM UP CLASSES 1W, 2W

To be held open all day, each day, at every height. No cross entry restrictions. For the convenience of our exhibitors, you may enter this class at any time and enter as often as you wish. Rider must adhere to the posted warm up course. No ribbons will be awarded.

Hunter Division

HUNTER COURSES: Courses offered at this show will consist of 7 to 9 fences with one or two direction changes. The fences will simulate obstacles found in the hunt field, such as brush, posts and rails, walls, in-and-outs, gates, etc. Course diagrams will be posted at least one-half hour before each class.

<u>UNDER SADDLE CLASSES</u>: Horses to be shown at walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight error. No martingales permitted.

BEGINNING WALK

Open to the beginning rider that has never shown at trot, canter or over fences. Riders will walk and demonstrate other skills at judge's request. Show champion and reserve if there are three or more in the division. No year-end champion awards. Class 206—Beginning Walk Under Saddle Class 207—Beginning Walk Pleasure Class 208—Beginning Walk Over Poles

WALK TROT HUNTER

Open to the beginner rider who has never shown over fences at any show on any horse. Riders may only cross-enter into Walk Trot Barely Canter. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

Class 209—Under Saddle Class 210—Walk Trot Pleasure Class 211—Trot Over Poles

WALK TROT BARELY CANTER

Open to the beginner rider who has not shown over fences at any show except the Beginning Canter Division with two crossrails. Riders will be asked to canter individually. **Riders may cross-enter into Walk/Trot classes or Beginning Canter Classes, but not both**. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

BEGINNING CANTER HUNTER

Open to the beginner rider who has not shown over fences at any show except the crossrail divisions. For class 213/214, riders will jump over 1 single crossrail, then two outside lines. Riders may trot or canter. **Riders may not cross-enter into any Walk Trot classes**. Riders can only cross-enter into Walk Trot Barely Canter or Beginning Rider divisions, **but not both**. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

Class 212—Beginning Canter Under Saddle Cla

BEGINNING RIDER HUNTER

Open to the beginner Jr. or amateur rider of any age who has never shown over fences exceeding 2' at any show on any horse. The jumps measure 18" and do not include gates. Trotting not to be penalized. Riders may not cross-enter into any class where fences exceed 2' on any horse. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

BEGINNING HORSE HUNTER

Open to the horse of any age that has never shown over fences exceeding 2' at any show with any rider. Horse may not cross-enter into any class where fences exceed 2'. The jumps measure 18" and do not include gates. Over fence classes may run concurrently with Beginning Rider Hunter classes. Trotting not to be penalized.

Open to amateur riders showing ponies 14.2 hands and under. Fences are 2'0" or 2'3"; oxers are narrow. Riders to declare height they desire to jump at the gate.

WALK/TROT EQUITATION

Open to the beginner rider who has never shown over fences at any show on any horse. The Judge will not ask for circles in the flat classes of this division. Riders may cross enter only into Walk Trot Barely Canter. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

WALK TROT BARELY CANTER

Open to the beginner rider who has not shown over fences at any show except the Beginning Canter Division with two crossrails. Riders will be asked to canter individually. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

BEGINNING CANTER EQUITATION

Open to the beginner rider who has not shown over fences at any show except the crossrail divisions. For class 213/214, riders will jump over 1 single crossrail, then two outside lines. Riders may trot or canter. **Riders may not cross-enter into any Walk Trot classes**. Riders can only cross-enter into Walk Trot Barely Canter or Beginning Rider divisions, **but not both**. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

Class 112—Beginning Canter Equitation FlatClass 113—Beginning Canter Equitation CrossrailsClass 114—Beginning Canter Equitation Crossrails 2nd round

BEGINNING RIDER EQUITATION

Open to the beginner Jr. or amateur rider of any age who has never shown over fences exceeding 2' at any show on any horse. The jumps measure 18" and do not include gates. Trotting not to be penalized. Riders may not cross-enter into any class where fences exceed 2' on any horse. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

MINI EQUITATION 2'0

Open to riders who have never shown over fences exceeding 2'3". Fences are 2'. Trotting for lead changes is permitted. Horse rider combinations which have won Season-End Champion or Reserve Champion twice will no longer earn points or win Season-End prizes in this division.

Open to the beginner rider who has never shown over fences exceeding 2'6" on any horse. Fences may be set up to 2'3"; all oxers are narrow. Rider may not cross-enter any other class where fences exceed 2'6".

The classic hunter phase, consisting of 7-8 fences with 2 high options shall be judged on quality, movement, jumping style, manners, and way of going. After completing the classic phase, horse will pass through a set of markers to begin the handy phase. Handy hunter phase, consisting of 5-7 fences with 2 high options shall be judged on classic qualities while also rewarding pace, brilliance, and shorter track. Combined two-round score determines placings. Derby does not count toward any season-end show champion award. A minimum of 5 entries is required to run the class.

Rider must be a member of Southern Nevada Hunter Jumper Association while earning points throughout the show season.

AWARDS AND PRIZES

Prizes 1st through 3rd place. Ribbons awarded through 8th place. Prize money is paid as follows: 1st 30%, 2nd 25%, 3rd 20%, 4th 15%, 5th 10%. If the Derby is not sponsored, the prize money will be 100% add back of the entry Fee's received.

- 2'9" SNHJA Medal Final riders may not cross enter into another equitation or hunter division where the fences exceed 3' in height or a jumper division where the fences exceed 3'3".
- Last chance to qualify for Medal Finals will be at the March show.


